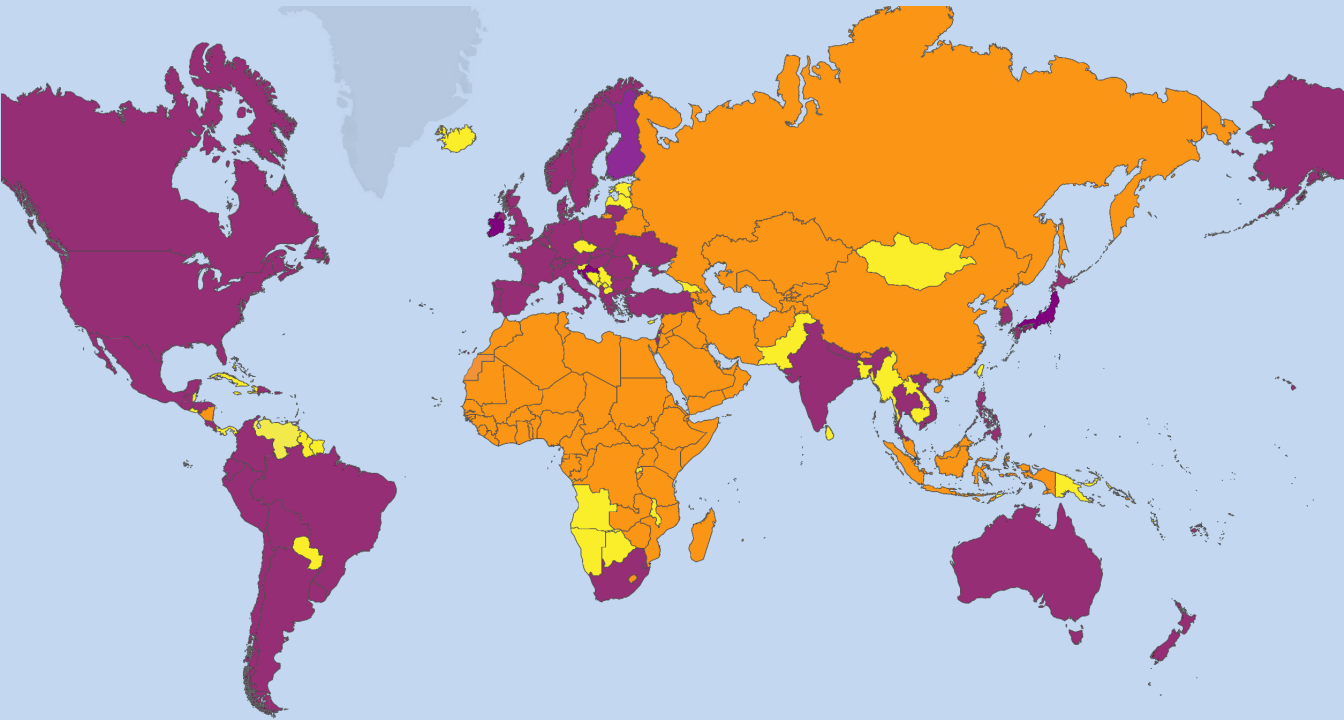


PRIDE AROUND THE WORLD IN 2021

NOTE: In Pakistan, activists informed OutRight that only trans people were able to publicly celebrate Pride because same-sex relations are criminalized.

A survey respondent from Pakistan pointed out that while trans pride is celebrated in Pakistan, lesbian, gay and bisexual people cannot openly march. Pakistan legally recognizes a third gender but criminalizes sexual relations between people of the same sex.
